Things to remember to include in your float presentation to the class (they may be in any order):

Statistics:

- Capital
- Indigenous Populations
- Other important cities
- Year of statehood
- Population

Geography:

- Major farm product or natural resource
- Terrain (landforms: list as many as apply such as desert, plains, mountains, etc.)
- Location in the U.S. (region it belongs to)
- Size (area in square miles)

Interesting Facts:

- State nickname
- State Bird
- State Flower
- Landmarks and tourists attractions
- Other state symbols (if found)

BONUS!

- Famous people
- You may also include any other information that you found if there is time.

Remember that you only have 2-4 minutes for your presentation so plan accordingly. You may use note cards but try not to read too much! The more you have practiced, the easier it will be.
