Week 1: April 11-15

A. Research: Gather the facts required for your float. Use resources from the classroom, a library, the computer, etc.

B. Decide on a creative way to present the information on your float. You may decide to choose a "theme" related to your state.

Week 2: April 18-22

Transfer the information that you researched to the materials that you will display on your float.

Week 3: April 25-29

Begin constructing your float.

Week 4: May 2 - May 6

Continue with float construction and display. Begin preparing/practicing a short presentation (no more than 4 minutes) to share with your classmates about your float.

Week 5: May 9-13

Add any final details to complete your float. Continue practicing your short presentation about your float.

Week 6: May 16-19

Bring in Floats - May 16, 17, 18 or 19.
